WEEKLY SUMMARY

Our percentages of increase are looking better, especially in money, as we begin 1968. As of Thursday we had a 62% increase in money from mail receipts only and a 22% increase in letters. We ended 1967 with increases of 23.28% in income from mail receipts, 16.12% in letters, and 23.03% in White Mail. We are receiving outstanding responses to the 'Personal From the Editor' in the December PLAIN TRUTH about food and health, and Mr. Ted Armstrong's recent series of programs on air, water, and food pollution. We are receiving many questions and hundreds of requests for literature along this line.

LONDON: One substantial offering for the week ending January 25 has helped lift the income from last week's 44% increase to a figure 52.5% above that for January a year ago. The mail response has fallen somewhat and is only a tenth of one percent above January last year.

SYDNEY: Through January 25 the percentages of increase are very low with 21.1% increase in mail and only 4.4% increase in money. These low percentages are mainly due to the two week, nation-wide postal strike.

MANILA: After a low count in both money and letter receipts during the past few weeks, we finally recouped this week! Money received this week leaped to an overwhelming increase of 232% over last week, and 98.4% over last year!

JOHANNESBURG: The week ending January 25 compares very well with the corresponding period last year. The total mail shows a 37% increase for the week; for the month so far we have a 91% increase. The White Mail for the week took a 100% leap over last year with 210 new requests for The PLAIN TRUTH. Money for the month shows a 50% increase.

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February ended with a 23% increase in money for mail receipts only. A few good loans came in during the month to give a boost to the overall increase The letter increase was 10%, which is somewhat better than the 3% increase we received in January. White Mail continued above 12,000 for the third week in a row.

LONDON: February continues quite well as regards money--this being now 36% above February last year. The letter count has, however,

fallen back to a 3% decrease as of the 23rd.

SYDNEY: Thus far the month of February has been a good month with 103.8% increase in letters and 90.5% increase in money. This gives us for the year 65.2% and 50.3% increase in letters and money respectively over the same period last year. The last two ads in the Women's Weekly have done very well. Number 9 ad on health has brought in a total of 1,887 responses while number 10 on marriage, in less than one week, has brought in a total of 670 responses. Almost all of these responses are new and will be added to The PLAIN TRUTH list.

MANILA: Compared to last year at the same time this week's letters increased by 92.5%. We received 5,621 letters this week, bringing February's total to 22,191 -- our highest monthly record ever! We topped our

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WEEKLY SUMMARY

April has started with a bang compared to March. We set an all time record in money for a single day on Wednesday, and it appears the all time weekly record will be broken also if the income continues to hold up through Friday. As of Thursday, we have a 73% increase in money for the first four days of April compared to the same period of last April. By contrast, the letter increase is nil. In fact, we still have a deficit figure through Thursday, but expect to show a slight increase after Friday's mail is in.

BRICKET WOOD: The decline in the income has stopped and is showing the same percentage increase as last week—i.e. 18% above that for last year. The mail figures have recovered from the 11% decrease reported last week to a figure about the same as March a year ago, showing neither increase or decrease.

VANCOUVER: Even though the percentage for mail is quite low: 10% for income and 17% for letters, the first quarter of 1968 is higher than expected. The request for new subscriptions is the highest for any quarter on record.

SYDNEY: The first three weeks of March show a 66.7% increase in mail and 36.9% increase in money.

JOHANNESBURG: Through March 21 we have a 38.3% increase in letters and a strong increase in money.

SPANISH: Increase this week over last year-mail 125%, money 55%.

April ended with only 14% increase in money over April '67 and 6% increase in letters. White Mail for the month showed 2½% decrease compared to April of last year. The mail for this week has been fairly strong for this time of the month—should total about 30,000 letters. The White Mail count should top 10,000 this week for the first time since March 29. We hope this trend will continue through May since April's White Mail count was so disappointing. There has been a good response to the April PLAIN TRUTH. People have especially been interested in the articles "Who Killed Jesus Christ?" "The Bible Answers Short Questions From Our Readers" and "Worst Money Crisis in Three Decades."

SYDNEY: For the month of April, so far we have had an increase in money of 20% and 27.8% for mail. The Holy Day offerings boosted the money from a very low figure, and the mail for this week has been quite low also.

MANILA: The Mail count increased by 51.4% over that of last week and 164% over last year's at the same period. Money receipts increased only by 1.2% over last week's and 19.9% over last year's. Our April ad on "I'm ready to quit--but what went wrong with our marriage?" already brought in 1,109 responses. We now have 23,767 requests for Mr. Armstrong's Autobiography.

Until Thursday we have shown a decrease for June in both letters and money. However, the letter count picked up to more than 6,000 letters for today. When the money count is finished it should give us a slight increase in both money and letters through June 6. The White Mail is rather low for the week and it appears now that the count will be barely more than 7,000 for the week. We hope to see this count improve next week. The Semi-annual Letter has been mailed to all the Members and Co-workers already and we are starting to mail it to the Regulars as the week ends. Response should start coming back in the early part of next week.

LONDON: This week the money increase is 6.6% above that for May last year. The mail figures are -28% below May of a year ago. We are continuing to receive a number of favourable comments on Mr. Royer's article in the April magazine, "Who Killed Jesus Christ?"

JOHANNESBURG: For the week ending May 23 we had a total of 1,269

letters. This is 57.2% above the corresponding week one year ago. We also had a 297.5% increase in ad responses. "Personality" by itself shows a 22.5% increase. Money for the month so far is 13.7%.

SYDNEY: For the month of May our increase is low at 5.8% in money and 5.4% in mail. However, the year so far is bringing us a good increase especially in the mail. We have 33% increase for money and 54.2% for mail.

Weekly Comments : Worldwide

July 5, 1968

<u>WEEKLY SUMMARY</u>

Semi-annual returns are averaging fewer than 2,000 letters a day this week. Since we were receiving heavy returns from the Semi-annual at this season last year, we are showing a deficit in letters. Last July was our largest month on record for letters received with 249,734 letters. That means we will probably run a deficit in letters through the rest of the month. The money count is doing considerably better this week due to a good response to the latest Co-Worker Letter. The percentage of increase through Thursday, July 4, is 20.9. The nation-wide TV GUIDE ad has brought in almost 10,000 responses through the same date. By far, the heaviest response is coming from Tucson, Arizona. The circulation is not very large in that area, but the percentage of response is more than twice as high as most other areas.

FOREIGN WORK: Mail returns are coming in well from most of the foreign offices, but the percentages are low, due to an excellent Semiannual return last summer. The increase in money for the first 28 days of June is only 7.4%, while the mail count is up 11.0%. However, the mail count for the seven offices outside England is an excellent 43%, showing how important England's contribution is to the Foreign Work. Canada had the best returns in June, with a 22% money increase and an excellent 109% mail growth.

Weekly Summary

July ended with only a 3.5% increase in money from mail receipts We had a 42% decrease in letters which was more or less expected since we were up against the Semi-annual returns for last July. One very discouraging note is that we showed a 14.9% decrease in White Mail for July. Our White Mail has improved somewhat this week. Quite a number of people are mentioning how they enjoyed the "on the spot" broadcasts from Munich. Items most heavily requested are The PLAIN TRUTH.

FOREIGN WORK: The increase in letters for the first three weeks of July is an exact 30%. This includes the best increase in England since last August-22%. More than half of England's mail in July was in response to the five ads: The LONDON TIMES (two ads) with 6,238 responses; DRIVE magazine with 5,001; The SUNDAY EXPRESS with 3,918; READER'S DIGEST with 1,095, for a total of 16,252. Responses are continuing to come in at about 500 per day for the first two days of August. The German office has received 681 READER'S DIGEST responses, an average of 140 per day, or TRIPLE their normal daily letter count! Money increase continues to be poor, averaging +1% for the four offices re-

The mail picture looks rather bleak following the Labor Day weekend but we hope to see it pick up considerably through Thursday and Friday. Through Wednesday noon we show a 42% decrease in both money and letters. Responses to the first ad in LIFE have reached 2,924 today. This is not a very good response but we expect it to climb in the next few days. So far we have received two responses to the second LIFE ad.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

Response from the telecast on pollution and requests for the booklet have been excellent from the stations on the west coast this week. The most heavily requested booklet from the broadcast this week has been 'The Wonderful World Tomorrow' with requests running as high as 50% in one day's white mail. In the past several months we have noticed a marked increase in requests from educational institutions, teachers, and ministers for multiple copies of various pieces of our literatature such as 'Hippies' and 'Happy Marriage.' The overall mail count has been just fair for the final week in the month and it appears we will probably finish October with a 14% increase in money from mail receipts only and about 22% increase in letters.

FOREIGN WORK: October is turning out to be even better than September. September had a record of 92,450 letters and 120% increase. Through October 25, the mail is 204% over last October, and may well become the Foreign Work's first 100,000-letter month. Bricket Wood is up 280%, Sydney is up 134%, and most of the smaller offices are over 100%. Money is only up 14% so far, but should reach about 30% when all offices report. Total British ad response through Thursday is 51,158, this week's total being 1,840.

WEEKLY SUMMARY:

We are receiving an enthusiastic response to the Semi-annual Letters. The response began Wednesday, November 27. The number of responses doubled each day until Tuesday of this week when it multiplied with a count of 10,608. Thursday was even higher with a count of 12,577. The total mail count for those days was 14,418 and 15,339 respectively. A new financial record for a weekday was set Wednesday. As this summary is being written Thursday, it appears there is a possibility the money count may be about as high today but we do not have enough of the mail processed to tell. We are having to work well into the evenings just to pull the money.

FOREIGN WORK: The month of November closed very favorably, with a 115% increase in letters and a 12.3% increase in money. This November's income is compared to an excellent November last year and appears to be another record month in both money and mail. Foreign ad responses now total more than 120,000 including 2,000 from Malta last month. The year-to-date increase for the Foreign Work is now 42.5% in letters and 14.8% in money, after a poor first seven months.
