

Council Proceedings.
COUNCIL ROOM, LIMA, Nov. 23, 1874.
 Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members present, Bond, Jackson, Black and Watt.
 The Council was called to order by John Black, and the journal of last meeting was read and approved.
 A motion was made and adopted that the City Commissioner be instructed to notify the parties owning property joining on Main street south of the river to Circular street, that if they did not put the sidewalk on East side of Main street in good and passable condition within three days, that he would proceed to do the same at the expense of said property.
 A petition was introduced and read for the first time asking that the Sunday ordinance be so modified that the bathers could open their shops on Sunday from 7 o'clock a. m. to 10 o'clock. A motion was made that the petition be laid on the table. The vote was taken and the motion was carried.
 The contract of lighting the street lamps and care of the same was awarded to the Lima Gas-light Co., at \$25 per month.
 The Board of Improvement reported the completion of Frank Wright's West Street stoning contract and recommended the payment to him of \$205 00 for 725 42-100 cubic yards of stone.
 The Board also reported the completion of the contract of G. G. Rupert, for the stoning and graveling of north Main, and recommended the payment of of \$1040, 00 for 822 35-100 cubic yards of stone and gravel put on said street.
 They also reported the completion of B. Bowers & Co's contract for the stoning and graveling of Jackson street and recommended the payment to them of \$225, 00 for 490 cubic yards of stone at \$1, 25 per cubic yard. The reports were received and adopted, and the clerk was authorized to issue orders for the various amounts recommended, less the orders already issued to the parties on the contracts.
 Patrick Maloney was awarded the contract of refilling the sewer running from the Dayton & Michigan shops south to the Railroad Y. at 8 cent per yard, for the amount of earth filled in sewer.
 On motion Council adjourned.
