In the heyday of American tele-evangelism, Garner Ted Armstrong and his famous The World Tomorrow were glants of the genre. It was estimated that by the end of the 1970s he was earning \$75 million a year. His radio show, which preceded the TV show, was so popular that in 1980, Penthouse magazine described him as "the living-room preacher to a subculture of lonely, frightened, disoriented Americans".
