Dear Fellow Ministers,

Greetings again from Headquarters! The Commencement Exercises this afternoon will mark the close of another College year here at Pasadena. Mr. Herbert Armstrong will deliver the Commencement Address and present diplomas to the 87 graduating seniors—a record number! Also, four Master of Arts degrees will be presented. Mr. Frank Brown will receive his Master of Arts degree in Theology, and three of our Imperial School teachers will receive their Master of Arts degrees in Education. These include Mr. John Thomas, Mrs. Floyd Lochner, and Mrs. Paul Knedel. We are certainly pleased with the fruit being borne this year, and I extend my warmest congratulations to all of the graduates!

All of you will remember the Bradesku trial--in which a jury found the College and Mr. Armstrong guilty of "alienating the affections" of Mr. Bradesku's wife. The plaintiff, Mr. Bradesku was awarded \$30,000 in damages. However, the judge has not yet ruled on the case. He can overrule the decision of the jury and decide in our favor, or he can uphold the jury's verdict. The entire case has been without precedent, and the outcome so far has apparently been unpopular among the judge's peers. He appears to be weakening under the pressure and has offered us a settlement if we will agree not to appeal it to a higher court. Of course, we won't accept any kind of settlement short of acquital, as Mr. Armstrong emphatically informed the judge through our lawyers.

The judge is going to rule on the case this Monday--which happens to be Pentecost. I hope those of you who get this letter in time will fervently ask God to give us favor in the eyes of this judge so that we won't have to appeal the case. We are confident that we would win an appeal, but we would certainly like to avoid any further publicity about the case, if possible.

Mr. Armstrong's appointment on May 28 with the Vice-President in charge of the foreign editions of the <u>Readers' Digest</u> was postponed until next Wednesday, June 5. He will, at that time, present two samples of advertising copy to the officials, and we are hopeful that this will result in our being able to run ads in both the British and Australian editions of the <u>Readers' Digest</u>. Please remember this in your prayer also!

- The Work received a <u>record donation</u> during the week of May 21. It was a donation of stocks which are worth about \$349,000: Of course, by itself, that amount would only last about <u>five days</u>, but it certainly provided a boost at that time of the month when we needed it.
- → I would like to mention something else about the income at this point and ask all of you for your help in this regard. The <u>Building Fund</u> is still very low--even after Mr. Armstrong's letter earlier in the year. Please admonish those who have neglected to respond to Mr. Armstrong's letter to get on the team and become active, productive members of the Body of Christ.

People in the world will zealously and wholeheartedly support their political candidates, but we have some members who will not grasp the opportunity to get on the bandwagon of the <u>real winner</u>! It is for their good as well as the good of God's Work. <u>God</u> does not need the money. His Work does, however, and He is allowing them the opportunity—the <u>great blessing</u>—of being able to give to that Work. None of us can outgive God, and those who are <u>doing their part</u> are truly being blessed—in many ways. Some <u>are</u> shouldering their responsibility, and some are even going above and beyond in doing their part. But others aren't. Please exhort them in a <u>positive way</u> to wake up to their responsibility toward the Building Fund which <u>God</u> has instituted.

- At the same time, please remind the brethren to send in their tithe of the tithe. This Festival Fund will benefit them directly at the Feast, and we urgently need financing for improvements which are continually being made at every Feast site. It would be good if those who have not yet done so would estimate the total amount of second tithe that they will have by the Feast, and send it in to Headquarters marked as "Festival Fund."
- Mr. Armstrong has approved our proceeding with a plan to erect two giant metal buildings by next year--one at the Pocono Feast site and one at the Lake of the Ozarks Feast site which is now being developed. These buildings will seat 15,000 people and cost only about \$200,000 each, which is less than half of the original cost of the big tabernacle in Big Sandy. New building methods make this possible, and the buildings will look nice from the outside--not at all like the old tabernacle. These buildings will only be shells, but they will still be much better in every way than tents.
 - A couple of Bible Studies began this month. On May 5, the first Bible Study in Somerset, Kentucky met with 103 in attendance. Mr. Robert Bertuzzi will conduct this monthly Bible Study. And on Sunday, May 26, Mr. Clarence Bass flew up to St. Lucia to begin a monthly Bible Study there. He also began a class later that afternoon to teach reading and writing to those desiring to learn in order to study God's Word. Mr. Bass reported, by the way, that the Church at Barbados is now up to over 140 in attendance!
- Mr. Carn Catherwood is on his way to Paris, France to assume duties as the pastor of that Church which Mr. Colin Wilkins formerly pastored from Geneva.

He was to have been in Paris by tomorrow, but the recent riots there may delay his arrival. He is one we should especially remember to pray for in this situation and also for our brethren there.

I have a couple of birth announcements to give you. Mr. and Mrs. Roger West announced the birth of their 8 pound and 4 ounce son, Jonathan Lee, on May 16. Mr. and Mrs. Lyall Johnston in Auckland, New Zealand, announced the birth of their 8½ pound daughter on May 17. Congratualtions on your new arrivals!

Most of the men assigned to the Field for the <u>summer</u> from Pasadena will arrive in their areas on June 4, and the men with permanent assignments should arrive by June 13. Those being sent out from Big Sandy will arrive a week later-on June 11 and June 20, respectively. The men from Bricket Wood with permanent assignments should arrive by July 1.

The new Baltimore District will begin on June 25, and effective after Pentecost, the Churches in Little Rock and Ft. Smith will become a part of the Nashville District, while St. Louis and Belleville will become a part of the Chicago District. On August 10, Oklahoma City and Tulsa will become a part of the Kansas City District, as the new Minneapolis District will begin at that time. Effective immediately, Denver and Pueblo will become a part of the Headquarters District. The proposed Church at Syracuse, New York has been changed to Rochester and should begin about the middle of June. At that time Mr. Ivan Sell will become the pastor of Buffalo and Rochester, and Mr. Gary Antion will move to Toronto, beginning Kitchner right away. When these changes have been effected, Toronto and Kitchner will become a part of the Detroit District. The complete moving schedule is enclosed with this letter.

A problem recently came up which I need to clarify for the benefit of all of you who from time to time have the unpleasant responsibility of disfellowshipping members of God's Church. We have in the past used a Disfellowship Card as a means of stopping literature to individuals who were incapacitated and could not read it, especially in such cases where unconverted relatives might use the literature in a wrong way. There are some instances where all member literature must be stopped, but from now on you should do this by memo rather than by sending in a Disfellowship Card. If you are sure that the individual was never converted or had willingly turned from God's truth, that is another matter, but in cases where the minds of elderly persons have simply deteriorated and they are senile, don't send in a Disfellowship Card on them. Stop their literature if necessary, but continue to visit them and help them in any way possible. This has been no huge problem, but I wanted to clarify it and ask you to just ignore the "Senility" category on the Disfellowship Card until it is reprinted.

wanted to mention that we expect to reach our maximum on-campus enrollment here at Pasadena this coming fall--which will be 550 students. Married students and special students living off-campus will push the total enrollment over 600! This means that we will accept about 200 new freshmen

for this fall, and this entering Freshman Class of 1968 will be the <u>first</u> to face the real possibility of <u>not</u> graduating from Ambassador College! Fellow ministers, we may have only 3½ years left in which to finish this Work! Those of us here at Headquarters vividly realize that God's Work <u>is entering a new phase--the final</u> phase that will carry the Gospel to the world with a mighty and irresistible power!

It is becoming increasingly evident that the preceding 34½ years of the Work have been the groundwork and only a prelude to the accomplishment just ahead, as Mr. Armstrong has often said. It is appropriate at this time of year to remind ourselves of this once again and to gird up the loins of our minds! Many of us will be taking vacations soon, and as always, we will humanly tend to let down right at this time when we should be gearing ourselves for even greater service and zeal. Let's avoid the summer doldrums personally and set ourselves to help God's people do the same. We have to keep our eyes on the goal—on God's Kingdom—especially at this time of year. Continue to pray for us here at Headquarters and for each other!
