Paul and the Term “Law”

Peter warns us that

“And count the patience of our Lord as salvation, just as our beloved brother Paul also wrote to you according to the wisdom given him, as he does in all his letters when he speaks in them of these matters. There are some things in them that are hard to understand, which the ignorant and unstable twist to their own destruction, as they do the other Scriptures. You therefore, beloved, knowing this beforehand, take care that you are not carried away with the error of lawless people and lose your own stability.” (II Peter 3:15-17, ESV)

It would appear from this, Peter is warning that “lawless” people were twisting Paul’s writings. These are described as “lawless people” in verse 17. The word is G113 in Strong’s Concordance:

“ἀθεσμος

athesmos

ath'-es-mos

From G1 (as a negative particle) and a derivative of G5087 (in the sense of *enacting*); *lawless*, that is, (by implication) *criminal*: - wicked.”

Around the 1st century the term meant to be Violating divine law or temple sanctity, moral lawlessness (such as homosexuality), violating ancient custom. It was used thus in the Septuagint, by Josephus, Philo, Plutarch etc.

There can be no mistaking, then, that it referred to God’s commandments and His Law.

A list of verses has been assembled below from the Apostle Paul’s epistles where he uses the words "law" (Greek: νόμος, *nomos*) or "commandment" (Greek: ἐντολή, *entolē*), including the complete verse text from the English Standard Version (ESV). Each verse has been categorised based on whether it refers to **Old Testament commandments, Torah, rituals and sacrifices, laws of the Pharisees**, or **law of sin and the flesh**, as requested. Additionally, a chart has been included summarising the frequency of each category.

Methodology

- **Each time Paul makes reference to law:** ie Romans, 1 & 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 & 2 Thessalonians, 1 & 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon).
- **Greek Terms:** Focus on νόμος (law) and ἐντολή (commandment), identified using standard Greek New Testament texts (Nestle-Aland/Textus Receptus).
- **Categorisation:** Based on context, each verse is assigned to one or more of:
 - **Old Testament commandments:** Specific moral laws (e.g., Ten Commandments).
 - **Torah:** The Mosaic Law as a whole (Pentateuch/legal system).
 - **Rituals and sacrifices:** Ceremonial aspects (e.g., circumcision, sacrifices).
 - **Laws of the Pharisees:** Traditions or oral laws of the Pharisees.
 - **Law of sin and the flesh:** The principle of sin or human nature opposing God's will.
- **ESV Text:** Full verse text from the ESV for each occurrence.
- **Chart:** A Chart.js bar chart summarizing the frequency of each category.
- **Additional References:** All relevant verses are included by cross-referencing standard concordances.

Note: It is easy miscategorise one of the texts below. Feedback to correct and improve this paper is appreciated.

Verses with ESV Text and Categorisation

Below is the list of verses where Paul uses νόμος or ἐντολή, with full ESV text and categorisation.

Romans

1. Romans 2:12

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For all who have sinned without the law will also perish without the law, and all who have sinned under the law will be judged by the law."
- **Category:** Torah
- **Explanation:** Refers to the Mosaic Law as the standard for Jews.

2. Romans 2:13

- **Explanation:** Implies the moral aspects of the Mosaic Law.

5. **Romans 2:17**

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "But if you call yourself a Jew and rely on the law and boast in God..."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law as a source of Jewish identity.

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "So, if a man who is uncircumcised keeps the precepts of the law, will not his uncircumcision be regarded as circumcision?"
- **Category: Torah, Rituals and sacrifices**
- **Explanation:** Moral aspects of the Mosaic Law versus ceremonial circumcision.

10. **Romans 2:27**

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Then he who is physically uncircumcised but keeps the law will condemn you who have the written code and circumcision but break the law."
- **Category: Torah, Rituals and sacrifices**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, contrasting moral obedience with ritual.

11. **Romans 3:19**

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)

- **ESV:** "Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law as a standard of judgment.

12. Romans 3:20

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law reveals sin but cannot justify.

13. Romans 3:21

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—"
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law (and broader Scriptures) points to Christ.

14. Romans 3:27

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith."
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** "Law of works" refers to the Mosaic Law/human effort; "law of faith" is metaphorical.

15. Romans 3:28

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law cannot justify.

16. Romans 3:31

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Do we then overthrow the law by this faith? By no means! On the contrary, we uphold the law."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law is upheld through faith.

17. Romans 4:13

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For the promise to Abraham and his offspring that he would be heir of the world did not come through the law but through the righteousness of faith."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law contrasted with faith.

18. Romans 4:14

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)

- **ESV:** "For if it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law as a potential basis for inheritance.

19. Romans 4:15

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For the law brings wrath, but where there is no law there is no transgression."

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "for sin indeed was in the world before the law was given, but sin is not counted where there is no law."
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law defines sin; sin existed prior as a principle.

22. Romans 5:20

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Now the law came in to increase the trespass, but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more..."
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law amplifies sin's effect.

23. Romans 6:14

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For sin will have no dominion over you, since you are not under law but under grace."
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, linked to sin's power.

24. Romans 6:15

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means!"
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, contrasted with grace.

25. Romans 7:1

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)

- **ESV:** “Or do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives?”
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law’s authority.

26. Romans 7:2

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage.”
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law (marriage laws).

27. Romans 7:3

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.”
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law (marriage laws).

28. Romans 7:4

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God.”
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, from which believers are freed.

29. Romans 7:5

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death.”

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law stirs sin in the flesh.

32. Romans 7:8

- **ESV:** “But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. For apart from the law, sin lies dead.”

34. Romans 7:12

- **ESV:** “So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.”

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law and its commandments are good.

39. Romans 7:25

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself serve the law of God with my mind, but with my flesh I serve the law of sin.”
- **Category:** **Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**

- **ESV:** “For the mind that is set on the flesh is hostile to God, for it does not submit to God’s law; indeed, it cannot.”

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, resisted by the flesh.

44. Romans 9:31

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “but that Israel who pursued a law that would lead to righteousness did not succeed in reaching that law.”
- **Category:** Torah
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, pursued for righteousness.

45. Romans 9:32

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Why? Because they did not pursue it by faith, but as if it were based on works. They have stumbled over the stumbling stone...”
- **Category:** Torah
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, pursued wrongly.

46. Romans 10:4

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes.”
- **Category:** Torah
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, fulfilled in Christ.

47. Romans 10:5

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "For Moses writes about the righteousness that is based on the law, that the person who does the commandments shall live by them."
- **Category:** Torah, Old Testament commandments
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law and its commandments.

48. Romans 13:8

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law."
- **Category:** Torah, Old Testament commandments
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, fulfilled by love (moral commandments).

49. Romans 13:10

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law."

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law's moral commands fulfilled by love.

50. Romans 16:26

1 Corinthians

51. 1 Corinthians 7:19

- **Greek:** ἐντολή (entolē)
- **ESV:** "For neither circumcision counts for anything nor uncircumcision, but keeping the commandments of God."
- **Category:** Old Testament commandments
- **Explanation:** Moral commandments, not ceremonial laws.

52. 1 Corinthians 9:8

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Do I say these things on human authority? Does not the law say the same?"
- **Category:** Torah
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law (Deuteronomy 25:4).

53. 1 Corinthians 9:9

- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Old Testament (Isaiah 28:11-12), broadly the Torah.

57. 1 Corinthians 14:34

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "the women should keep silent in the churches. For they are not permitted to speak, but should be in submission, as the Law also says."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** Likely the Mosaic Law (e.g., Genesis or legal traditions).

58. 1 Corinthians 15:56

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law."
- **Category: Torah, Law of sin and the flesh**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law amplifies sin's power.

2 Corinthians

59. 2 Corinthians 3:7

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos, implied)
- **ESV:** "Now if the ministry of death, carved in letters on stone, came with such glory that the Israelites could not gaze at Moses' face because of its glory, which was being brought to an end..."
- **Category: Torah, Old Testament commandments**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law (Ten Commandments on stone).

60. 2 Corinthians 3:13

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos, implied)
- **ESV:** "...not like Moses, who would put a veil over his face so that the Israelites might not gaze at the outcome of what was being brought to an end."
- **Category: Torah, Old Testament commandments**

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law's temporary glory.

61. 2 Corinthians 3:15

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos, implied)
- **ESV:** "Yes, to this day whenever Moses is read a veil lies over their hearts."

Galatians

62. Galatians 2:16

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "yet we know that a person is not justified by works of the law but through faith in Jesus Christ, so we also have believed in Christ Jesus, in order to be justified by faith in Christ and not by works of the law, because by works of the law no one will be justified."
- **Category: Torah, Rituals and sacrifices**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law, including ceremonial works (e.g., circumcision).

63. Galatians 2:19

- **ESV:** "For through the law I died to the law, so that I might live to God."

72. Galatians 3:18

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.”

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law versus the promise.

73. Galatians 3:19

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary.”
- **Category: Torah, Rituals and sacrifices**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law’s temporary role.

74. Galatians 3:21

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** “Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law.”
- **Category: Torah**

- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law cannot give life.

75. Galatians 3:23

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law as a guardian.

76. Galatians 3:24

- **Greek:** νόμος (nomos)
- **ESV:** "So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith."
- **Category: Torah**
- **Explanation:** The Mosaic Law's temporary role.

77. Galatians 4:4


